Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG) **Glan Usk Primary School**

As a school, we get allocated 3 grants by Welsh Government which allows us to provide support, training and initiatives across the school for pupils and staff. The impact of our grant spending is monitored and the impact measured against pupil outcomes and the standards of teaching and learning throughout the school. One of which is the Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG). A requirement of being issued with the PDG grant is that we publish how the grant is being used.

Below is how we have allocated the PDG Grant for the 2014-2015 financial year:

- The total number of pupils on school roll for September 2014 is 670
- The School's Free School Meal(FSM) population is under 25%
- This is fewer than the population for the previous year
- The total allocation of PDG to this school for September 2014 to July 2015 is £92,718
- The school undertakes the following activities in order to support pupils facing the challenges of poverty and deprivation:
 1. Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up support
 2. Peer Coaching for staff with a focus on provision for FSM children
 3. Pupil Learning Review (PLR) days
 4. ICT Ambassadors
 5. Pupil & Parent Support Worker to run Family Learning Sessions and a Parent Nurture Programme
 6. More Able and Talented (MAT) children who are entitled to FSM
 7. Equalities Steering Group
 8. Pupil VOICE team
 9. Subsidise the cost of trips and visits
 10. Rewriting the Future PLC
 11. External course costs
- The school's Pupil Deprivation Grant (PDG), School Effectiveness Grant (SEG) and Welsh Effectiveness Grant (WEG) are regularly scrutinised by the Governing Body, supported by advice from the EAS and monitored by the Local Authority.



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
