

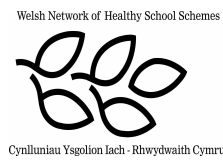

Managing Behaviour Positively





Positive Behaviour Management

Positive behaviour management is used throughout Newport schools. It gives a clear framework for encouraging good behaviour and co-operation.

In Glan Usk Primary we use positive behaviour management in order that:

Each child can:

- ✓ Learn effectively
- ✓ Be treated fairly
- ✓ Work and play in a safe environment
- ✓ Work and play without being hindered by others
- ✓ Understand that others have the same rights

Parents can:

- ✓ Know how their child is behaving at school
- ✓ Support and encourage their child to follow our 'Golden Rules'

School can:

- ✓ Make each day a fresh start
- ✓ Give children clear, consistent rules for behaviour in school
- ✓ Make clear the rewards children can expect for following the rules
- ✓ Make clear the consequences of inappropriate behaviour
- ✓ Encourage children to take responsibility for their own behaviour
- ✓ Help children to mature and develop good behaviour

Golden Rules

GOLDEN RULE – Respond immediately to the signal for attention

Our whole school behaviour policy is REACH:

Inside School

- Treat everyone and everything with respect
- Give out as many 'friendship tokens' as you can
- Follow instructions first time
- Keep hands, feet and unkind words to yourself
- Use an appropriate voice level at all times
- Be welcoming to everyone we meet
- Be a good citizen

In the School Playground

- Be proud of yourself and our school
- Keep Glan Usk tidy, use the litter bins
- Use all equipment sensibly and carefully
- Take turns, share and play nicely with each other
- Always walk to the playground zones
- Practise good sportsmanship and fair play

Lunchtime

- Always be respectful and polite to our Midday Supervisors and Canteen Staff
- If anything drops on the floor pick it up
- Any leftover food or litter should be placed in the bin or taken home
- Eat with your mouth closed
- Chat with your friends but keep the noise to a suitable level
- Try everything in your lunchbox or on your plate and don't rush your food to go out to play
- Respond to requests from lunchtime monitors

Rewards and Consequences

A range of 'Rewards and Consequences' are used at Glan Usk Primary to assist with managing behaviour positively. These include:

Rewards

- Verbal praise
- Stickers
- Individual rewards
- Group awards
- Whole class merits/termly rewards
- Certificates
- Messages home

Consequences

(circumstances will determine progression through the consequences)

- A look
- Positive reinforcement of the behaviour required
- First warning – recorded
- Second warning – removal from situation
- Class Teacher – Parent discussion
- Third Warning - Removal of privileges – time out
- Inform Assistant Headteacher and parents/carers
- Persistent inappropriate behaviour will warrant a further meeting with the school leadership team to discuss the way forward.
- Serious acts of misbehaviour, including malicious use and comments made on social media and anti-social behaviour may result in the Headteacher issuing a fixed term or permanent exclusion.

NB Any incidents of any form of bullying e.g. racism, cyber bullying etc, reported to and dealt with by the Leadership Team are recorded electronically and this information is collected termly by Newport Local Authority.

How Can Parents & Carers Help?

Positive behaviour management works best when home and school work together. Poor behaviour can hinder a child's progress and disrupt the progress of other children.

Please reinforce achievement with praise and interest when:

- ✓ Your child tells you about what they have done in school
- ✓ Teachers tell you about good work/behaviour
- ✓ Your child brings home stickers or certificates
- ✓ Your child brings home something he/she has made in school

Please support the school when unacceptable behaviour is reported by:

- ✓ Discussing the situation with your child and talk about the behaviour you expect
- ✓ Reminding your child of the 'Golden Rules' and Glan Usk Green Lights
- ✓ Praising improvement when it is reported to you

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact your child's class teacher.

Voice Levels

Children are encouraged to use an appropriate voice level for different situations. These are modelled by staff and reinforced regularly.

- Partner voice
- Group voice
- Class voice
- Outside voice

Good Citizenship
